A male suspect described as 5 feet 8 inches to 5 feet 11 inches and 235 to 250 pounds entered the store and said, “This is a hold up.” The suspect pointed a handgun at the clerk and ordered the clerk to remove the money from the register and place in a bag. The suspect left on foot with an undetermined amount of money. He was wearing a black hooded sweat shirt and black pants and had a cloth over most of his face.

Click it or Ticket: Law Enforcement Unite to Save lives



Half of Virginia’s Road Deaths Avoidable with Belt, Restraint Use *Law Enforcement Out in Full Force During Click It or Ticket*

Seat belts prevent ejection and without one, a person’s body becomes a missile inside the vehicle. [Local law enforcement agency or locality] along with DMV’s Virginia Highway Safety Office encourages everyone on the road to wear their seat belts during every trip, day and night.



Law enforcement officers in [your locality] and across Virginia and the nation will be out in full force looking for seat belt violators during the national Click It or Ticket enforcement mobilization this May. “If you’re not buckled up, you will get a ticket,” warned [local law enforcement]. “Don’t risk death or injuring others in your vehicle. If you’re driving, the second action you need to take after fastening your own seat belt is to insist all your passengers are wearing their belts too.”

Day and night, local law enforcement officers are on the lookout for those not wearing their seat belts--and for good reason. In 2012 in the U.S., 61 percent of passenger vehicle occupants killed at night (6 p.m. – 5:59 a.m.) were not wearing their seat belts. “Local law enforcement officers are actually trained to spot seat belt violations at night, so just because it’s dark, don’t think they won’t be able to spot unbelted drivers,” said [local law enforcement.]

Virginia’s statewide seat belt use rate was 79.7 percent in 2013 and 78.4 percent in 2012. Last year in Virginia, 54 percent of all traffic fatalities, or 310 deaths, were unrestrained drivers and passengers. Also, 118 (38 percent) of the unrestrained deaths were young people ages 21 to 35, and 73 percent were males. Most of the unrestrained fatalities, 144 or 46 percent, occurred between the hours of 6 p.m. and 3 a.m. Of the 228 unbelted driver fatalities, 55 (24 percent) had been drinking.

Drivers (75.7 percent) and passengers (68.8 percent) in pickup trucks had the lowest seat belt use rates, along with passengers (69.4 percent) in work vans.

“These numbers tell us young males, many of them pickup drivers who’ve been drinking, are not buckling up and dying on our roadways,” said [local law enforcement]. “We want to do everything we can to reach these people and save their lives.”

Those who drive and ride in pickup trucks may think that their large vehicle will protect them more than other vehicles in a crash. This false sense of security may cause them to not wear their seat belts, but the stats show that this bravado is misplaced. “Everyone, no matter what vehicle they are in or if they are a driver or passenger, should always buckle up,” said [local law enforcement.]

On December 30, 2013 at approximately 4:30 p.m. a traffic crash occurred in the 900 Block of Blue Ridge Avenue in the Town of Bedford, which resulted in the hospitalization of Jory Michael Stanley, age 31 of Roanoke. Stanley was driving westbound when his 1999 Chevrolet SUV struck the rear of a 2000 GMC pickup driven by Richard Bunch of Lynchburg. When police arrived they found that the vehicle driven by Mr. Stanley was off the road and overturned near the intersection of Baldwin Street. Mr. Stanley had been partially ejected. The investigation revealed that Stanley was not wearing a seatbelt. He was flown by Life Guard 10 to Roanoke Memorial Hospital for treatment. On Tuesday, December 31, 2013 Stanley's condition was listed as stable but critical. Mr. Bunch was not injured.

Traffic was delayed for several hours while Bedford Police, assisted by the Virginia State Police, worked at the crash site.

There have been no charges placed and the investigation into the cause of the crash is continuing.

Five arrests made from investigation of home invasion in the Town of Bedford.

On Sunday, March 6, 2011 at approximately 4:00 a.m. a resident of the 1000 block of Gum Street in Bedford contacted the Police Department and reported a robbery. The Police were advised that several individuals had entered the residence by force and held the occupants at gunpoint while accomplices ransacked the home looking for money. The suspects left with a quantity of money and were reported to have entered a vehicle and traveled north on Peaks Street.

One resident was injured and treated at Bedford Memorial Hospital and released.

On August 27, 2013 the Bedford Police Department was recognized at the 88th annual Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police conference in Williamsburg for its traffic safety programs. 

On their arrival, they found that Evelina S. Nellum, age 56 of Bedford, had cut her husband, Terry, age 46 of Bedford, several times with a butcher knife. Ms. Nellum was charged with attempt first degree murder. The incident was related to a domestic disorder between the two. Ms. Nellum was taken to the Blue Ridge Regional Jail where she is being held without bond. Mr. Nellum was treated at Bedford Memorial Hospital.

Detention Orders Obtained for two juveniles in Bedford Middle School Burglary: On Friday, May 18, 2012 Investigators with the Bedford Police Department obtained detention orders for two 14-year-old juveniles for breaking into Bedford Middle School during the early morning hours of Sunday, May 13. Both juveniles were charged with the following:

- 1 count of Felony Property Damage (18.2-137 COV)**

**Click It or Ticket to Boost
Seat Belt Use – Day and
Night**

Motorists who refuse to wear their seat belts-beware. The 2012 national *Click It or Ticket* seat belt enforcement mobilization kicks off May 21 to help save lives by cracking down on those who don't buckle up.



Bedford Police Department is joining with other state and local law enforcement officers and highway safety advocates across the country to help save more lives by strongly enforcing all traffic laws, especially seat belt laws around the clock.

While Virginia's seat belt use rate increased slightly to 81.8% up from 80.5% in 2010, there is still much work to be done. According to the DMV Highway Safety Office's TREDS (Traffic Records Electronic Data System) in preliminary 2011 statistics, there were a total of 765 fatalities-306 of them were unrestrained at the time of the crash. Of the total unrestrained fatalities (306), 93 or 30.39% of them were between the hours of Midnight-6:00AM with 69.89% or 65 of those 93 between midnight and 3:00AM.

"Seat belt use is just too important to ignore", said Lt. Todd Foreman "We want to stress that regularly buckling up works, and we know of too many cases, largely at night, that all too often ends in tragedy." Lt. Todd Foreman went on to say, "Our goal is to save more lives, so Bedford Police Department will be out enforcing ALL traffic laws including seat belt use around the clock."

Regular seat belt use saves thousands of lives across Virginia each year. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) statistics show that in 2010 alone, seat belts saved an estimated 272 lives in Virginia. An additional 112 lives could be saved with 100 percent seat belt use.

While this year's *Click It or Ticket* enforcement mobilization runs from May 21-June 3, motorists should know that officers are out enforcing traffic laws, including seat belt laws year-round.

"Those who choose not to obey traffic laws and not to wear a seat belt will feel the heat from our officers who will be out cracking down on violators. Everyone in the vehicle should buckle up every time they go out, both day and night," said Chief James Day. "Our officers are prepared to ticket anyone who is violating the law and not buckled up...no warnings and no excuses. *Click It or Ticket.*"

On Tuesday, January 24, 2012 at Bedford City Council, the Bedford Police Department received its certificate from the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission (VLEPSC), which certified that the Department achieved its goal of being re-accredited. Chief Gary Roche from the Pulaski Police Department represented the Commission and noted that the Bedford Police Department is

one of less than ninety Departments statewide out of over four hundred, which are accredited through VLEPSC.

To meet the requirements of accreditation, a Department must be in compliance with 187 standards which are set by the Commission. Many of the standards have multiple bullets associated with them, which raises the total to over 400 requirements. In October, the Commission sent a team of assessors to review the Department; this review lasts three days. During the assessment, the team reviews the Department's policies and procedures, rides with and speaks with police officers on the job, and reviews files to ensure that the Department is following best practices in Law Enforcement as established by the Commission. The assessment report was then sent to the Commission, which approved the recommendation of the assessment team for Bedford's re-accreditation at Williamsburg during their regularly scheduled meeting in November. Each accreditation cycle is for a period of four years.

Chief Day complemented his Department and staff for the work that they did to achieve this very important status. He also gave special recognition to Sergeant Eddie Harmony for his hard work. As Accreditation Manager, Harmony is responsible for maintaining the files associated with all of the required standards.



At National Night Out on Tuesday, August 2, 2011, Officer Timothy Stanley of the Bedford Police Department was awarded the Traffic Enforcement Officer of the Year for 2010. This is the second consecutive year that Officer Stanley has won this award which recognizes the officer that leads the Department with a combination of speeding citations, seat belt and child safety seat citations, and arrests for driving under the influence. These are the areas that are stressed for enforcement because of their effectiveness in reducing traffic crashes.

There is a general correlation between traffic crashes and traffic enforcement efforts. Since 2007, when total crashes within the City of Bedford were 302, there has been a significant reduction in total crashes.

For calendar year 2010 there were 195 crashes, or a reduction of 35.4% from 2007. For the current calendar year through July 31, there have been 107 crashes which continues the downward trend.

AREVA Donates Two 3-D Laser Scanning Units to Central Virginia Regional Crash Team

AREVA is donating two 3-D scanners to one of seven regional law enforcement “crash teams” in Virginia on Tuesday, August 2 at 9:30 a.m. at AREVA's Old Forest Road office at 3315 Old Forest Road, Lynchburg. The equipment will make it possible for officers to capture the conditions of crime or accident scenes in digital 3-D environments. This functionality can aid in determining such information as vehicle speed and trajectory.

AREVA has used the equipment and subsequent 3-D models generated from the laser scan data for such tasks as component replacement or other plant modification projects.

Interference analysis and design studies can be staged virtually in a computer-aided design (CAD) environment. This type of project planning utilizing the 3-D data collected by the laser scanners minimizes project costs and risks while achieving accuracy.

Law enforcement agencies are using this type of scanner increasingly to enhance their current capabilities in forensics. The biggest obstacle for most agencies is the cost to acquire them. This equipment is valued at more than \$70,000.

“This generous donation by AREVA has afforded us with an opportunity to acquire technology and equipment that we would never be able to afford on our own,” said Captain Jim Bennett of the Bedford Police Department and Leader of the Central Virginia Regional Crash Team, one of the jurisdictions that will be utilizing the equipment. “These scanners will enhance our capabilities to reconstruct traffic crashes as well as crime scene

investigations. Our team is very excited about the potential to acquire the laser scanners and to start incorporating them into our work.”

The Central Virginia Regional Crash Team is comprised of the Bedford Police Department, Bedford Sheriff's Office, Virginia State Police, Vinton Police Department, Rocky Mount Police Department, Franklin County Sheriff's Office and the National Park Service. The team works very closely with the James River Regional Crash Team which is comprised of the Lynchburg Police Department, the Campbell County Sheriff's Office, Amherst County Sheriff's office and the Virginia State Police.

“AREVA is committed to the communities in which we do business,” said Chief Operating Officer Michael Rencheck. “This is another example of our efforts to be a good corporate citizen and to give back to our community.”

Bedford Cnty/VA Health Dept warns residents to make sure their pet and livestock rabies vaccinations are current

Over the next two days, Health Dept personnel will be going door-to-door to warn residents that a skunk the Dept collected on [July 11](#) from the Longwood Ave/Oakwood Ave/Greenwood Cemetery area tested positive for rabies.

Rabies is a virus that attacks the brain and central nervous system. It is transmitted from animal to animal and from animal to human through the saliva of an infected animal. Post-exposure treatment for humans must be administered prior to the appearance of any symptoms. Left untreated, rabies is fatal.

In order to protect your family and pets from rabies, remember to:

1. Vaccinate dogs and cats against rabies.
2. Report all animal bites to your physician, the Local Health Dept or Animal Control Office.
3. Stay away from stray or wild animals. These animals are generally not protected against rabies and may bite without warning.

Their trek will cover approximately four thousand miles and take them to twenty Friendship International chapters where they will meet children with special needs and the community at large.

Click It or Ticket

The Bedford Police Department will kick off the 2011 Click It or Ticket campaign working with Central Virginia Highway Traffic Safety Board by working a traffic checking detail on Rt. 29 on the Monacan Bridge Friday May 20th from noon to 2pm.

This check point begins the 2011 national Click It or Ticket seat belt enforcement mobilization, May 23-June 5.

Local law enforcement agencies will be conducting a number of enhanced enforcement programs over the next several weeks to include traffic check points, saturation patrols, education events and child safety seat checks. During the mobilization, officers will be cracking down on motorists who fail to wear their seat belts – both day and night.

“Law enforcement will be cracking down on Click It or Ticket violators around the clock. Local motorists should be prepared to buckle up. If law enforcement finds you on the road unbuckled anytime or anywhere, you can expect to get a

ticket — not a warning. No excuses and no exceptions,” said Chief James Day.

Two arrests have been made for vandalism at the Longwood Avenue cemeteries in the City of Bedford which occurred on May 2, 2011.

Investigators with Bedford Police interviewed several subjects this week and as a result of their investigation, two juveniles from the Bedford area have been charged with the following:

- 1) 18.2-137 Code of Virginia; Injuring, etc., any property, monument. This is a Class 6 felony when the amount of damage exceeds \$1000, which it did in this case.
- 2) 18.2-127B Code of Virginia; Injuries to cemeteries, burial grounds, etc. which is a Class 6 felony.

During the inquiry into the vandalism at the cemeteries, City investigators also found that the two juveniles had been involved in a larceny of a go-cart from the 1200 Block Oakwood Street. They each are charged with:

- 3) 18.2-95 Code of Virginia; Grand Larceny. This is an unclassified felony and is punishable by not less than one year or more than twenty years imprisonment with conviction.

Petitions were served and both subjects were incarcerated at the Lynchburg Juvenile facility pending a hearing before a Judge.

80% of all crashes and 65% of all near-crashes recently studied by the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute involved driver inattention within 3 seconds of the crash.

Check out these statistics to learn how your behavior behind the wheel puts you at an increased risk for a crash.

Behavior	Increased Risk
Texting (illegal in Virginia)	23 times
Reaching for a moving object	9 times
Driving drowsy	4 times
Looking at an external object	3.7 times
Reading	3.4 times
Applying makeup	3 times

Researchers at the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety have found that using a cell phone increases crash risk by 4 times. Since cell phone use occurs more frequently and for longer durations, this is the #1 source of driver inattention behind the wheel.

In 2009, 756 people died on the roadways of Virginia. There were more than 116,744 crashes and 62,796 people injured (DMV). Driver inattention was a leading factor in many of these crashes. That’s a big price to pay for a little distracted driving. Keep your eyes and mind on the road

Traffic Pattern Change Alert
